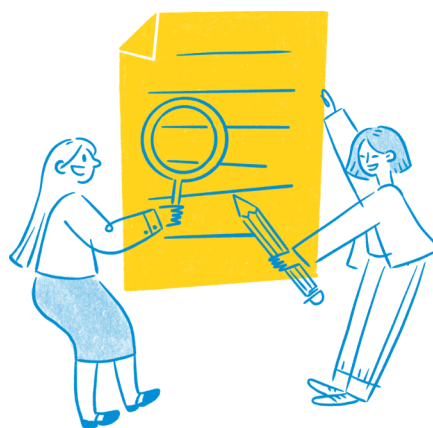

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# What is the POP Report?



Popular Financial Reporting, commonly referred to as the POP Report, falls within the category of **social reporting tools** that provide citizens with useful information from the Public Administration. The most important objective of social reporting is precisely to facilitate the interpretation of public activities, enabling citizens to understand the objectives pursued by the Administration, the actions taken to achieve them and the results actually obtained.

The POP Report therefore accounts to citizens in a clear, transparent and accessible manner, also with the aim of encouraging a shared decision-making process with the community.

Among the **objectives** of the POP Report:



Promote **clear and accessible contact channels** between citizens and the administration

Meet **accountability and transparency needs**



Provide **comprehensive information** about the Local Group

Highlight the **impact** of the Local Public Group on the **territory**



# Inside the POP Report: everything you need to know about the method



The [POP Report](#) of the Municipality of Dogliani stems from the desire to make our community's public accounts more understandable and transparent. The objective of this document is to provide citizens with a [simple, accessible tool](#) to understand how the Municipality's [resources](#) are collected and spent, beyond the technical, complex language of official financial statements.

We believe that [transparency](#) is a [right](#) and that understanding how the “municipal machinery” works is a first step towards [actively participating](#) in public life.

The data used refer to the years 2024 and 2023 and come from the official documents made available by the Municipality of Dogliani.

To make the figures easier to read and interpret, many budget items have been simplified and grouped into thematic categories that are closer to [citizens' everyday experience](#).

The preparation of the POP Report involved reading, translating into plain language, and reworking official documents to make them more [accessible](#) without altering their meaning. Charts, tables and infographics were created to visually support the data.

Moreover, the decision to simplify the language and the budget items inevitably entails a loss of technical precision. However, we believe that [simplicity](#) is necessary to allow everyone, even those without accounting skills, to navigate a topic that concerns us all.

The [POP Report](#) is also an opportunity to rethink the relationship between citizens and [institutions](#); for this reason, wherever possible, we sought to involve those who live and work in Dogliani in the process, collecting ideas, questions, and observations. The hope is that this tool will become the starting point for a broader [dialogue that fosters active, informed, and engaged citizenship](#).

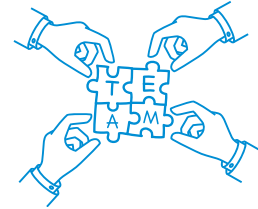

The coat of arms of the Municipality of Dogliani has been documented since the 17th century. It was recognised by Royal Decree on 7 June 1943 and officially granted on 4 December 1953.

Dogliani is a land of wines, craftsmanship, historic fairs, festivals and markets. The town lies in the heart of the south-western Langhe, in a natural basin surrounded by gentle hills, between the Monregalese and Alba areas. This is a land that has always maintained strong ties with its landscape and still preserves the urban layout shaped over time by history and human activity.

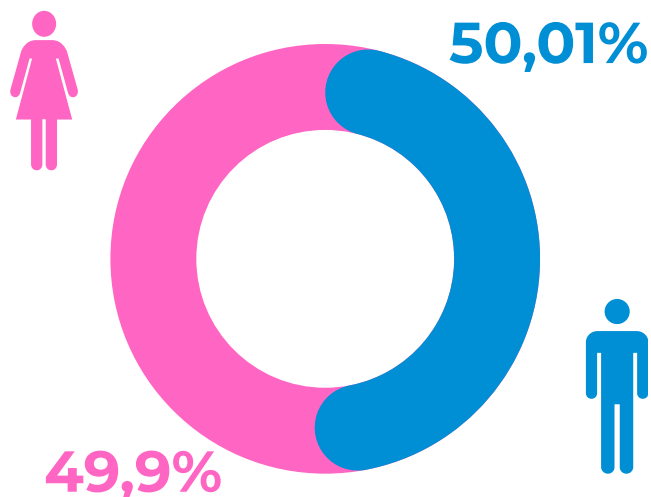

According to official data from the Registry Office, as at 31/12/2024 the Municipality of Dogliani had 4,627 inhabitants, with an almost equal distribution between 2,314 males and 2,313 females, and an increase of 40 inhabitants compared with 2023.

In 2024, 26 births and 58 deaths were recorded, resulting in a negative natural balance of -32, with a birth rate of around 0.55% and a mortality rate of 1.23%.

The average age of Dogliani's residents is 47.4 years, according to ISTAT data processed by Tuttitalia as at 1 January 2024, ranking the Municipality 4,416th out of 7,896 Italian municipalities.

This figure confirms the steady and progressive ageing of the population.



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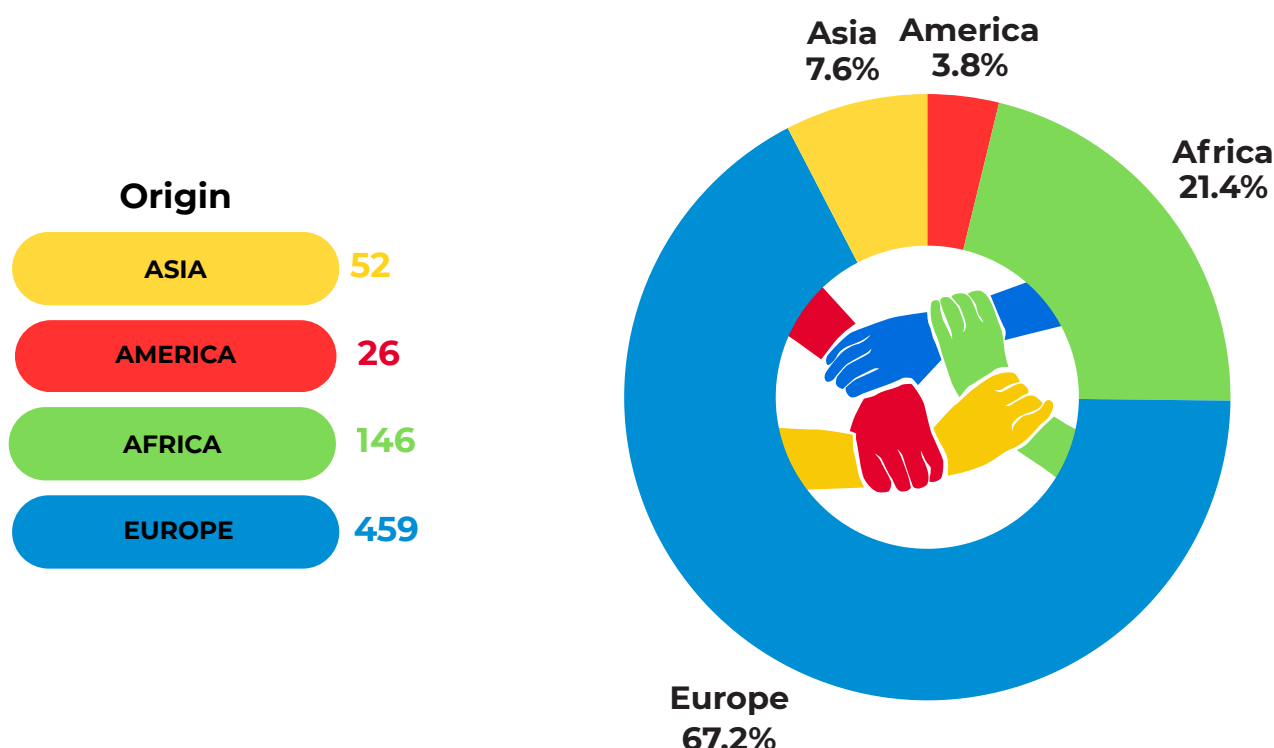
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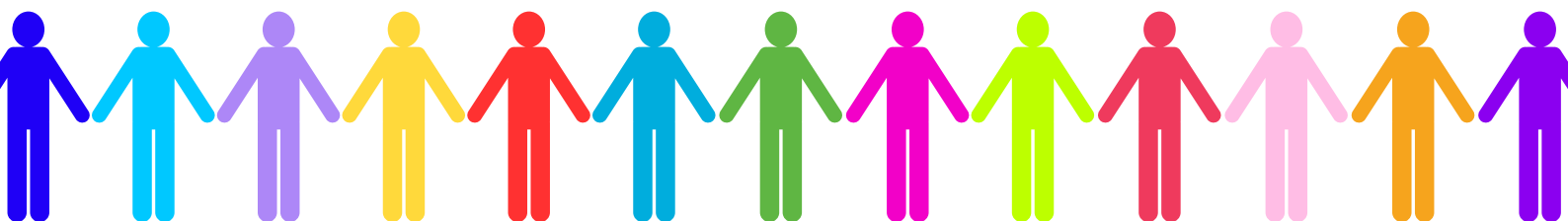

# Cultural diversity

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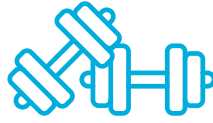

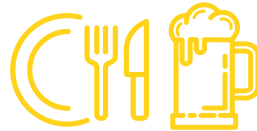

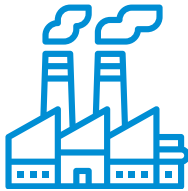

In 2024, the Municipal Council of Dogliani adopted 46 resolutions, an increase compared with 39 in 2023, while the Municipal Executive Board adopted 161 resolutions.

As regards meetings, the Municipal Council met 7 times in 2024, compared with 6 in 2023, while the Municipal Executive Board maintained the same number of meetings, with 35 meetings in both years.

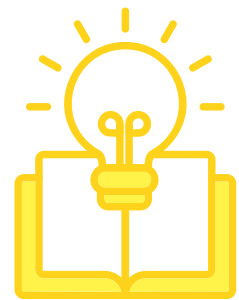
# Administration Result

The **Administration Result** of a municipality, also known as an administration surplus when positive or an administration deficit when negative, is the year-end result of municipal budget management.

It shows the difference between revenues and expenditure, while also taking into account the Municipality's payables and receivables. In essence, it is a financial balance that reflects the Municipality's situation at the end of the year.

## How should the data be interpreted?

The elements that make up the **Administration Result** are as follows:



- **CASH FUND** = the amount of cash available at the end of the financial year.
- **CASH BALANCE** = the difference between cash inflows and outflows of public administrations, namely their cash surplus or cash requirement. It measures the ability of public administrations to finance their expenditure.
- **RESTRICTED MULTI-YEAR FUND (FPV)** = funds already allocated and committed for projects to be completed in the future. Its purpose is to ensure coverage for committed expenditure that will become payable in subsequent years, using revenues already recorded in previous periods.
- **OUTSTANDING RECEIVABLES** = receivables not yet collected deriving from previous transactions.
- **OUTSTANDING PAYABLES** = payables not yet paid deriving from previous transactions.

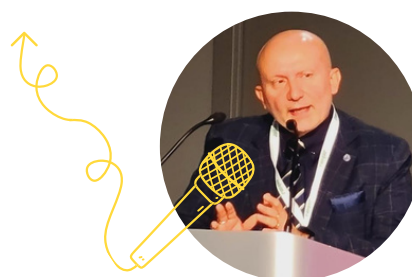
# Dogliani: the current situation

“ Public entity budgets, and in particular those of local authorities, are required each year to face and absorb difficulties arising from external events. Among local authorities, the Municipality is the most vulnerable link in the system, as it is closest to citizens and must deal with the daily issues of the community it administers.

The pandemic and international crises, which have sharply increased the cost of energy sources, have made municipal budget management much more complex. In the case of the Municipality of Dogliani, financial balances have been safeguarded thanks to the prudent management of the public administration, based on careful governance and precise coordination between spending capacity and the fulfilment of needs.

Furthermore, in recent years, thanks to debt control, through the decision not to take out new high-value loans, and by relying almost exclusively on resources from public contributions and capital revenues, such as urbanisation charges, significant budget surpluses have been generated in the Municipality of Dogliani. These have enabled public works to be completed and municipal assets to be maintained.

The hope and objective for the future is to continue this positive model of virtuous administration. ”

**Current tax, contribution and equalisation revenues** come from municipal taxes and contributions used to maintain public services.

**Current transfers** are funds provided by the State or the Region to support essential municipal services. **Non-tax revenues** derive from sources such as the rental of municipal properties, fines and the use of public spaces.

**Capital revenues** finance long-term investments, such as infrastructure and schools. Finally, **revenues on behalf of third parties and clearing items** are amounts collected by the Municipality on behalf of other entities, without decision-making autonomy, such as payroll withholdings.

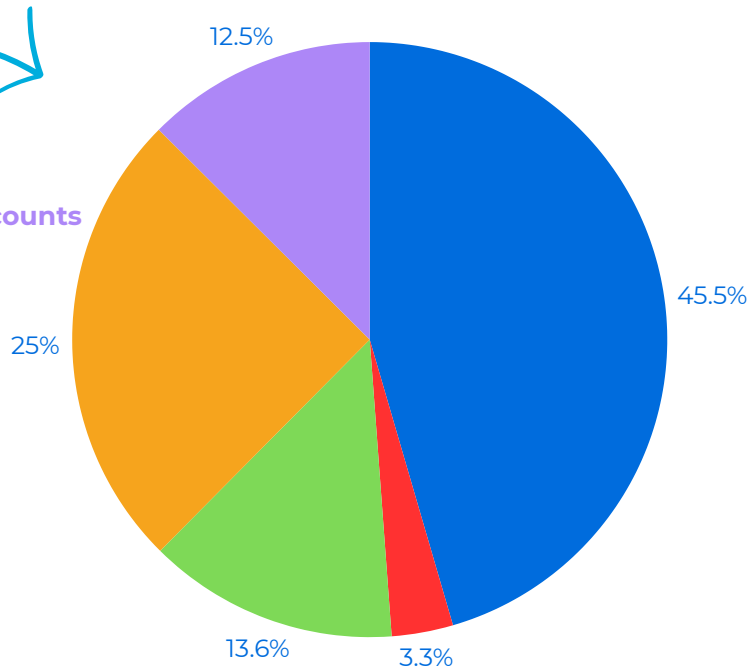


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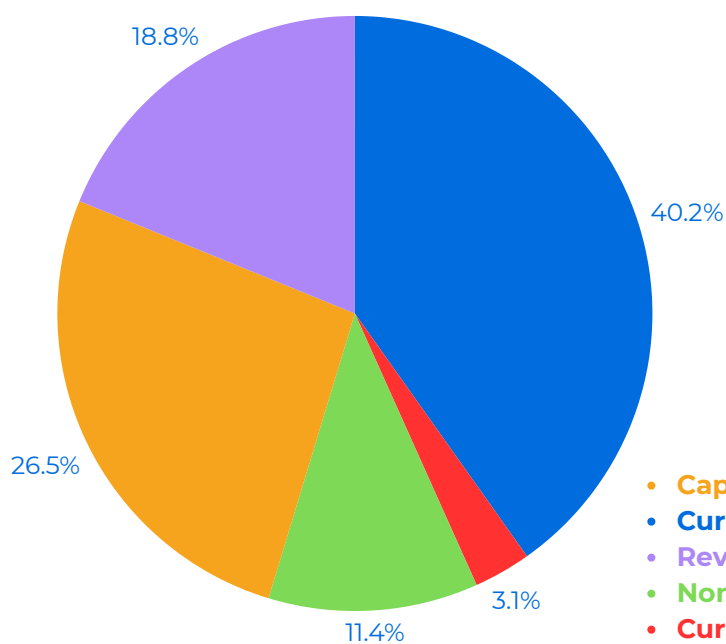

# Tax and Fee Revenues



## What are they?

**Tax revenues** are the amounts collected by the Municipality through taxes, duties and levies paid by citizens.

**Fee revenues**, on the other hand, are revenues deriving from contributions linked to specific services or activities.

## Revenues paid by citizens

The Municipality's main tax and contribution revenues paid by individual citizens are the following: **Ordinary IMU property tax**, **Municipal IRPEF surcharge**, **TARI waste tax**, and **the public-space occupancy fee**.

- **IMU**, the Municipal Property Tax, is due on the ownership of buildings, building areas, and agricultural land. Main residences are excluded, except for those classified under cadastral categories A/1, A/8 and A/9.
- **The Municipal IRPEF surcharge** (IRPEF being the Personal Income Tax) is applied to employees and all taxpayers subject to it, either through monthly payslips or directly on the income tax return. It helps finance part of the Municipality's services, following the greater financial autonomy introduced by fiscal federalism.
- **TARI**, the waste tax, is related to waste management in Italy. It is intended to finance the costs of waste collection and disposal services and is charged to the user.



- **The Unified Municipal Fee (CUP)** for concessions, authorisations and advertising displays replaces and brings together the following previous taxes and charges:
  - the fee for the occupation of public spaces and areas (TOSAP);
  - the municipal advertising tax (ICP);
  - fees for public billposting (DPA).
- **The Municipal Solidarity Fund (FSC)** is a funding mechanism for municipalities in Italy that aims to ensure a fair distribution of resources and reduce inequalities between local areas. This fund is financed by a share of IMU property tax revenue.
- **Contributions for social purposes** are additional transfers that supplement the Solidarity Fund and are intended to provide enhanced services for older people, transport for people with disabilities, and nursery school users.

The main purpose of the Municipality's tax and contribution revenues is to finance local public services, covering the expenditure for activities carried out by the Municipality for the benefit of the community. These funds, derived from taxes, fees, contributions, and other levies, are used to support infrastructure, public utility services, healthcare, education, culture, local economic development, and other areas of local public intervention.

## What are “Missions”?

In a municipal budget, “[missions](#)” represent the main functions and strategic objectives that the Municipality intends to pursue. They are a subdivision of public expenditure designed to make the main spending items more transparent, showing how public funds are actually allocated.

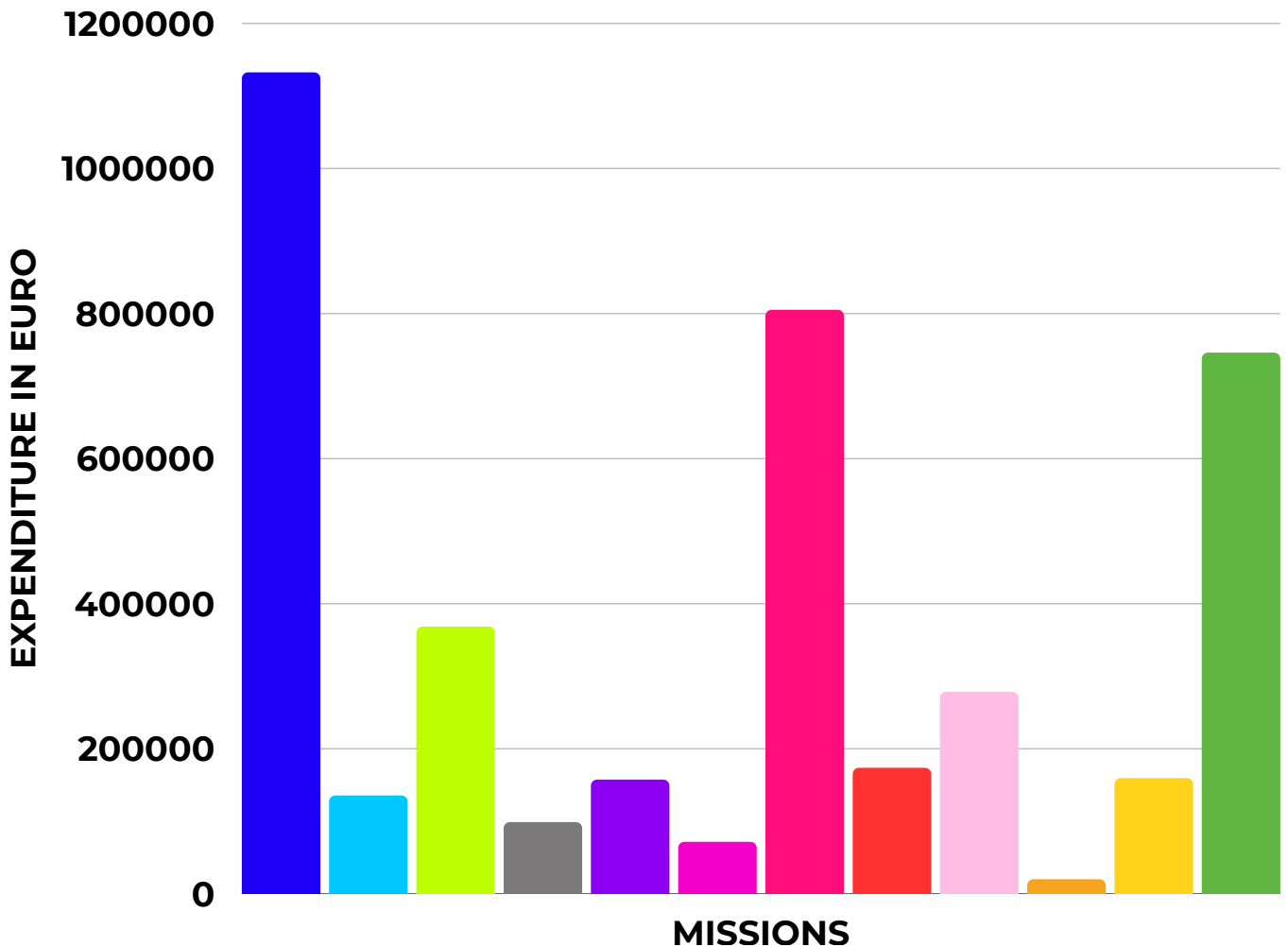

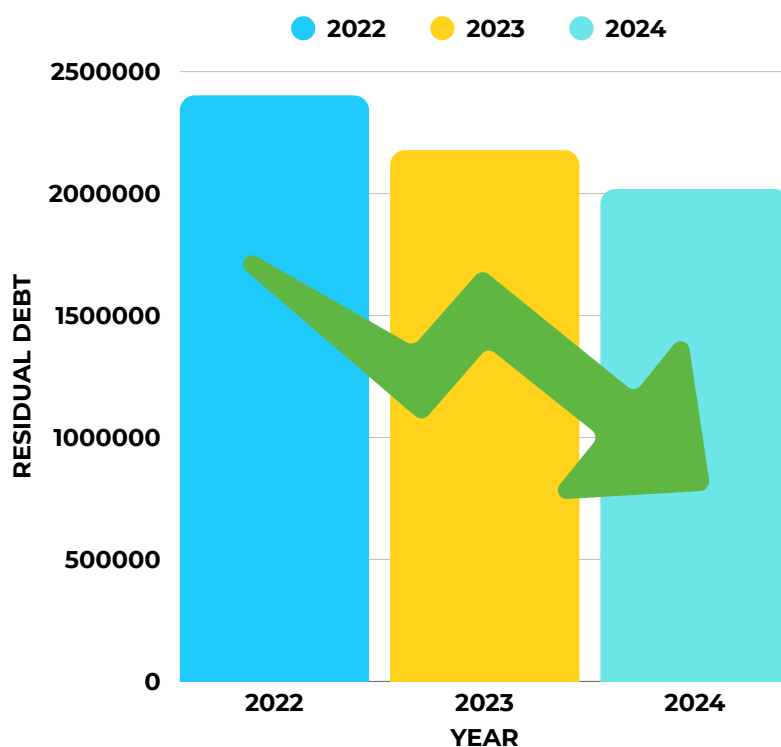
The **Municipality's debt** consists of amounts it owes to suppliers, banks, companies, or other entities.

The entire public debt of the Municipality of Dogliani arising from loans is long-term. The table shows that in **2023** and **2024**, the Municipality did not take out any new loans, while the administration is committed to repaying previous liabilities by paying the principal.

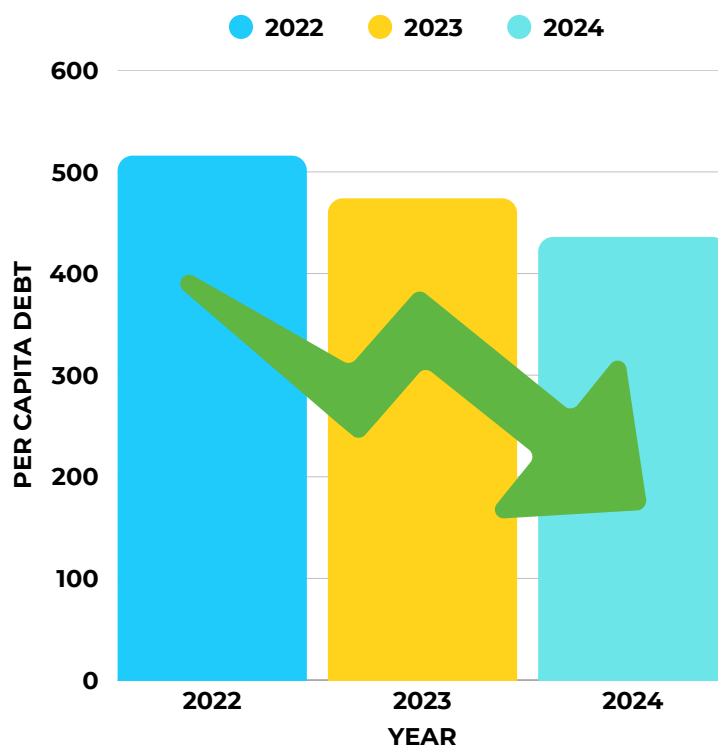
As at 31/12/2024, outstanding debt amounted to **€2,018,649.78**, corresponding to an average debt per inhabitant of **€436.28**.

# Building procedures

The [CILA](#), or Certified Notice of Commencement of Works, is a building procedure introduced by Conversion Law no. 73 of 2010. It allows certain works to be carried out on a property, provided they do not alter its structure and do not require a building permit.

The [SCIA](#), or Certified Start-of-Activity Report, is one of the building authorisation tools that allows certain types of construction work to be carried out after submitting a notification to the competent Municipality. It makes it possible to start the works immediately, without having to wait for authorisation to be issued by the municipal administration.

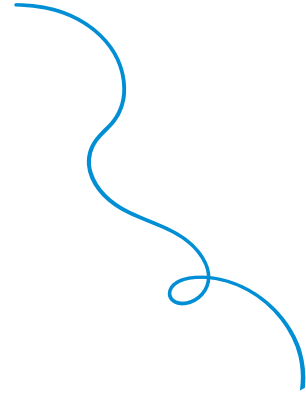


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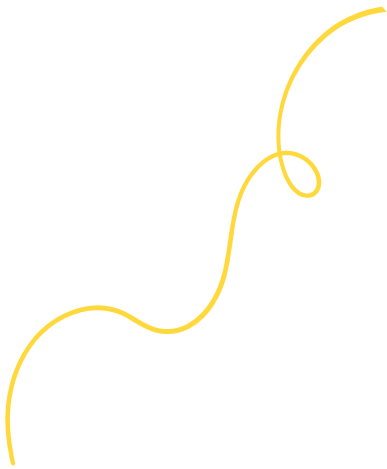

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# N.R.R.P.

The [National Recovery and Resilience Plan](#) (NRRP – PNRR in Italian) represents a historic opportunity to modernise our country.

With a total investment of [€191.5 billion](#), the NRRP aims to promote economic growth, sustainability and social inclusion.

## Main objectives:

- Ecological transition: promoting renewable energy and sustainable mobility.
- Digitalisation: improving access to digital services for citizens and businesses.
- Social inclusion: reducing inequalities and strengthening welfare.

The [C.S.S.M.](#) coordinates social and healthcare services on behalf of 28 municipalities in the Monregalese area, implementing actions to prevent hardship, promote well-being, and improve citizens' quality of life. Specifically, with regard to the Municipality of Dogliani, the services provided to older adults, people with disabilities and minors are as follows:

The Municipal Executive Board of Dogliani approved the granting of patronage for the project “A sirene spiegate”. Launched in 2020, the initiative takes place every year and is aimed at students of the Dogliani Comprehensive School. Its objectives are to raise awareness of the volunteer associations that operate in emergency response across the local area, the roles of the Local Police and volunteers, what to do and what not to do in the event of an emergency, road safety education, and how to address youth-related issues.

The Dogliani Library is a member of [MLOL – MediaLibraryOnLine](#), the first Italian network of public, academic and school libraries for digital lending. Today, the network includes more than 6,500 libraries across all Italian regions and in 25 foreign countries. To use MediaLibraryOnline, users must be registered with a participating library.

As regards the [active users](#) of the Dogliani Municipal Library, there were 322 in 2023, while in 2024 the number rose to 504 (+182).

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# Waste Management



Waste management is a crucial process for protecting the environment and public health. It includes activities such as:

- collection
- transport
- treatment
- waste disposal



The data show that, through its [waste collection](#) and [disposal methods](#), the Municipality can sustainably manage the waste generated by its residents.

The Municipality of Dogliani relies on [Azienda Consortile Ecologica Monregalese \(A.C.E.M.\)](#), which manages both separate waste collection and residual waste collection. The entire service is overseen by the Separate Waste Collection Office, located in the Town Hall and headed by Deputy Mayor Osvaldo Demaria.

Waste collection is organised through a [door-to-door system](#) across the entire municipal area. The only difference is that, in the hamlets, home composting is mandatory for organic waste.

- Gymnasium of the L. Einaudi Comprehensive Institute, Via Ghigliano 36.

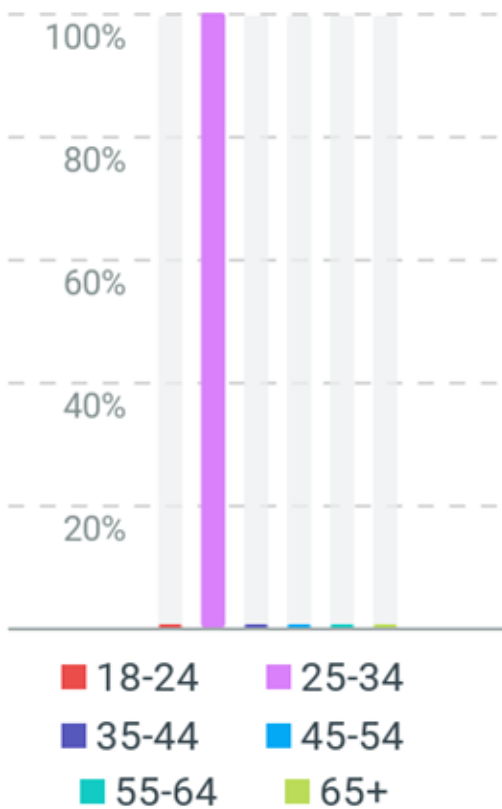

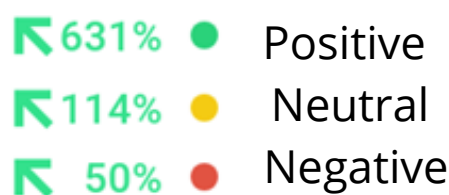
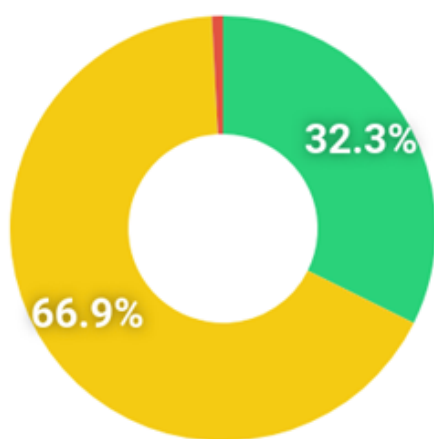








In sentiment analysis, **age** and **gender** help identify who expresses certain emotions. This information enables analysis of how different groups, such as young people, adults, men, and women, react to a specific piece of content or topic.

# Food and wine heritage, a cornerstone of Dogliani: “*La Bottega del Vino*”

The headquarters are located in the underground cellars of the former Carmelite convent, built in the [16th century](#), beneath the Town Hall and next to the Church of Saints Quirico and Paolo.

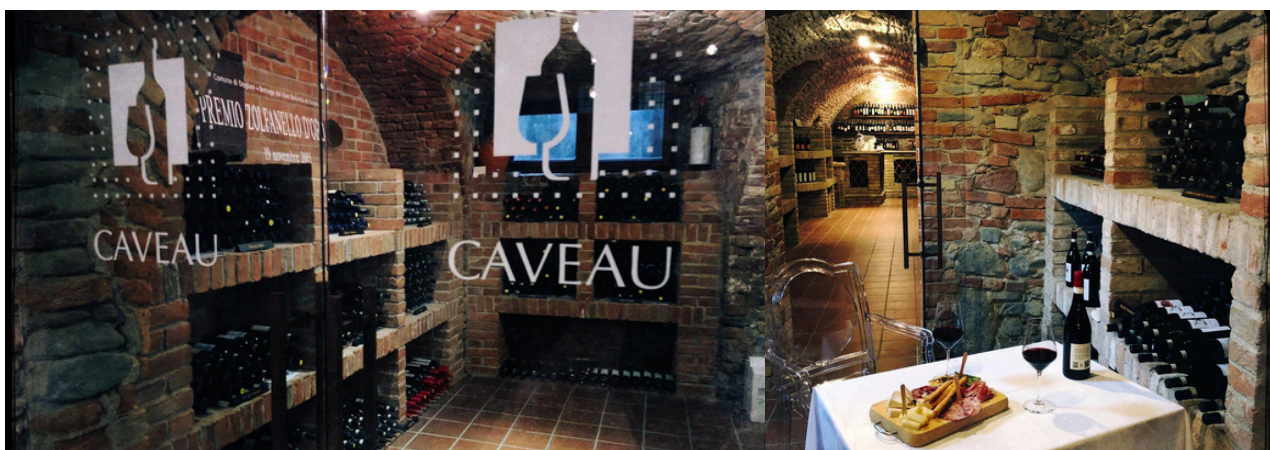
Here, visitors can find bottles from member producers to taste and purchase.

Founded as an [association](#) in 1984, ten years after the creation of the [Dolcetto Dogliani D.O.C.](#) designation in 1974, the Bottega del vino di Dogliani was strongly supported by all producers, who felt the need to join forces and work together for the young denomination.

Created and run with the support of the Municipality of Dogliani, the association has, over time, also become a place where producers can share experiences, discuss the future of the denomination, and consider new legislative proposals, acting as a kind of permanent forum.

Since 2012, the association has been joined by a consortium called [Bottega del vino Dogliani D.O.C.G.](#), made up of the member companies present in the Bottega and more specifically focused on promoting wines from the Dogliani area.

The consortium’s aims are to [promote](#) the local area, [strengthen](#) the image and [visibility](#) of wine production at both national and international levels, and act as a new institutional partner.



# Events



Dogliani is a lively and dynamic town, with a rich programme of unique and distinctive events that celebrate its history and culture while looking to the future. These events, which return each year with an increasingly rich programme, are made possible by the active participation of the people of Dogliani and of all those who share a passion for the town.

## Historic Cherry Fair

This is a historic event for the Municipality of Dogliani, attracting thousands of visitors every year.

The Cherry Fair usually takes place in June and is held across Dogliani Castello and Dogliani Borgo. To make the route more enjoyable, the Municipality of Dogliani provides a free tourist train connecting the two areas. In the upper part of the town, Dogliani Castello hosts artisans and artists, keeping local craft traditions and high-quality food production alive. There is also an excellent street food area featuring traditional dishes, tastings of quality products, musical entertainment, and activities and workshops for children and families.

In Dogliani Borgo, the historic centre of the lower part of the town, a trade fair takes place featuring over 150 stalls, including market vendors, agricultural producers, and hobbyists.

The archives of the Municipality of Dogliani preserve extensive documentation dating back to 1897, highlighting the fair's importance to the town at that time. Since 2011, the Cherry Fair has been recognised by the Piedmont Region as a Regional Fair.



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## Saints Fair and Cisirà

On 2 November every year, Dogliani opens its doors to “Cisirà” and the “Saints Fair”. In this corner of the Langhe, the vineyard-covered hills change colour, growing warmer and more inviting, while visitors are invited to enjoy traditional dishes that, at this time of year, are full of rich, intense flavours.

The undisputed star of this traditional autumn fair is “Cisirà”, a soup made with tripe and chickpeas, prepared according to an ancient recipe and distributed under the market hall in memory of a centuries-old tradition.



## TV Festival

For the 14th consecutive year, the Municipality of Dogliani hosted the “TV Festival”, an event that, for three days, turns the town into an open-air cultural workshop, with meetings, discussions and performances featuring leading figures from the world of television, journalism, music and culture.

The only Italian festival dedicated to television in all its forms, it is fully accessible and free.



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## Living Nativity Scene

As Christmas approaches, on the nights of 23 and 24 December, Dogliani stages the **Living Nativity Scene**, an evocative performance featuring around 350 costumed participants.

Great attention is paid to accurately recreating the settings, furnishings, goods, clothing, tools, situations, dialogues, and behaviours of Bethlehem on the Holy Night.

One of the largest in Italy, thanks to the participation of almost all the village's residents, this Living Nativity Scene owes its charm to the faithful reconstruction of the setting among the medieval alleyways of Dogliani Castello, the upper part of the town.

With the 2024 edition, this event officially celebrated its **50th** anniversary, an incredible milestone.



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# Dissemination Plan

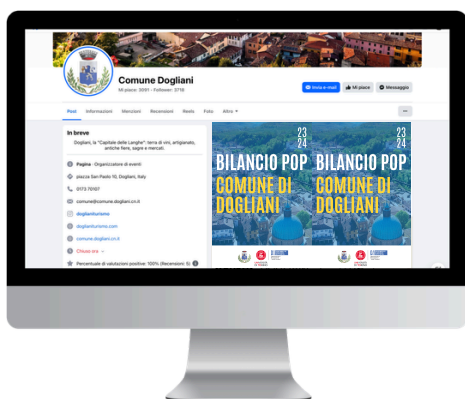
To ensure the POP Report is a truly **transparent** and **participatory** tool, we have developed a dissemination plan to actively engage citizens.

## Radis

The **Radis** project, from the Piedmontese word "Radice", meaning "root", was conceived and promoted by the Fondazione per l'Arte Moderna e Contemporanea CRT and is being held in Dogliani for the first time.

**Petrit Halilaj**, an internationally renowned Kosovar artist, created a site-specific work for Dogliani. Halilaj began with drawings found on school desks in Dogliani, which were combined with those by children from across the Balkans.

The work, inaugurated on 5 October 2025 (see photo), is located in the former school of Borgata Valdibà, which had been abandoned for decades, and will remain on permanent loan to the Municipality of Dogliani.

## Diorama

Dogliani offers an experience that goes beyond the traditional visit. With **Diorama**, the Sacra Famiglia Theatre becomes the beating heart of an immersive journey that engages the senses and the imagination. Thanks to projections on the walls, ceilings, and floors, visitors are transported into the landscape of the Langhe, among the vineyards and hills that have shaped the town's character.



It is not only about observing, but also about entering the history of Dogliani, experiencing the words of Luigi Einaudi, which express his deep bond with this land, and exploring the creativity of Giovanni Battista Schellino, who combined aesthetics and functionality in every corner of the town.

The exhibition is free and open every day from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.



## C'entro Anch'io

**C'entro Anch'io** is a project of the Municipality of Dogliani, launched as part of the Spazio Giovani call for proposals promoted by Fondazione CRC for the 2023/2026 three-year period, with the aim of continuing beyond that period. Its goal is to offer children and young people aged 3 to 14 a space for meeting, growth and participation through the revival of the Youth Centre.

The project promotes cultural, creative and school support activities, involving young people in artistic, musical, theatrical and scientific workshops, as well as in moments of celebration and social interaction throughout the year.

Carried out in collaboration with schools, social organisations, associations and local stakeholders, C'entro Anch'io aims to build a more attentive and inclusive community, capable of valuing its young people as key players in the local area.
